Term Commitments

The Murrell Academy prides itself on many things, one of them being class size. We believe that by keeping our classes small, each student receives individual as well as group attention.

Upon enrolment, a position for your child is reserved in a small class. It is imperative that this student to teacher ratio remain consistent, therefore we ask that term fees be paid **at the beginning of each term**. This reserves your child's position within their class for the entire term.
